Hello Everyone! Happy New Year! I hope that 2023 is fruitful and fulfilling for you and those you love.

On my walls at home - there are a few quotes that remind me every day (should I not take them for granted) of some value I am invited to fulfill to get the most out of life. One of my favourites: "Vivir con miedo es como vivir a medias." A life lived in fear is a life half lived.

The New Year presents an opportunity for each of us to assess our fears. And, then develop a strategy, a plan, a commitment, a motivation to CONFRONT them. As one of my favourite mentors Richard Rohr writes;

"The word change normally refers to new beginnings. But transformation more often happens <u>not when something new begins but when something old falls apart</u>. The pain of something old falling apart—disruption and chaos—invites the soul to listen at a deeper level. It invites and sometimes forces the soul to go to a new place because the old place is not working anymore." He suggests that, "The mystics use many words to describe this chaos: fire, darkness, death, emptiness, abandonment, trial, the Evil One. Whatever it is, it does not feel good and it does not feel like God. We will do anything to keep the old thing from falling apart."

Fear in its many guises will often try and distract us from moving forward, saying something truthful, being courageous among other things. The fear of failure, the fear of the unknown, the fear of not being liked, the fear of 'stuffing it up'! All valid in their own right and context. This is where 'faith' makes a difference.

Rohr goes onto say, "Transformation usually includes a disconcerting reorientation. Change can either help people to find a new meaning, or it can cause people to close down and turn bitter. The difference is determined by the quality of our inner life, or what we call 'spirituality.'"

As the Christmas Season continues - I hope that you will treasure that Jesus - Emmanuel = GOD IS WITH US, stoops to be with us. Now. Forever.
